

Step 7: Discipline of Obedience

LIVE OBEDIENTLY

The secret for a purposeful and fruitful Christian life comes from obedience to the Word of God and the motivating work of the Holy Spirit. In **1 John 2:3-4** the Bible says that a man who says he knows the Lord, but does not obey His commandments is a "liar." Why is he called a "liar"?

If a man knows the "Lord" (or Master), he should, therefore, be obedient to what He says. If he is not obeying, he does not know Him as Lord. Match the benefits on the left with the verses on the right. You must read each passage.

What does obedience mean ?

The dictionary defines obedience as, "the state of act of being submissive to another." According to this definition, which of the following phrases do you understand as truth?

- Obedience is following the path of least resistance.
- We must be obedient to an external authority.

Obedience is being resentful and stingy with our response to what is demanded.

Obedience is the attitude of yielding ourselves to God's way as we trust in His knowledge of what is best.

You should have chosen the second and fourth statements. Some believers live their lives refusing to yield themselves to God's way, because they are afraid that He might ask something of them that they are not willing to give. If the truth be known, if they would yield their lives to the Lord, they would

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discover that He would never ask them to do anything they were not suited for. In the meantime, their rebellion and refusal will cause them to lose God's blessing on their lives. Which of the following words reflects submissive obedience ?

If, in reality, we **trust** God, it is easy for us to obey Him in everything. We frequently try to serve God according to our way, in our spare time. Though this is better than nothing, it does not show submission to His authority. Which statements below best expresses this attitude ?

When a person thinks he can serve God by following his own **ideas**, he is wrong. Each one of the anterior sentences violates Scriptural commandments; However, they are the thoughts of many Christians.

Some think that obedience means losing the possibility of having fun and giving up personal possessions to appear humble. This is a form of **Asceticism**: depriving one's self and suffering in order to be spiritual. If we trust God with our lives, what promise do we have in **Psalms 37:4**?

Each one of us wants to receive the "petitions" or the desires of our hearts, but the obedient believer has the promise of God, that he will have them.

For some, an external or superficial conformity to *man's rules* is sufficient. It makes them feel more spiritual. In Isaiah 29:13, the prophet gives three negative descriptions of this superficial obedience. Write the three descriptions below.

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When a person attempts to more acceptable to God with words or deeds that men think are spiritual, thinking he needs to be more perfect, he is simply following *man's rules* in an effort to be more spiritual. This is called "*legalism.*" These "rules" become more important than God's commands. How did the people of Jesus' day treat God's commands compared with their traditions of right and wrong? (see Mark 7:9 for the answer)

Obedience is the heart attitude of yielding to any command of the Word God while depending on the power of the Spirit to obey it.

Why should we be obedient?

Motivation is always a special ingredient that precedes an action. So then, a believer must be motivated in order to be obedient. Can you put in one sentence why the believer should be obedient from your reading of **Revelation 4:11?**

In the <u>first place</u>, we should be obedient because He is **worthy** of glory, honor and power, because He has created everything for His pleasure.

It is easy to obey a person who loves us profoundly, as He loves us. In **1** John 4:9, how do we know God loves us?

By sending His Son, God showed us how much He loves us. Therefore, He who loves us so much deserves our trust and obedience.

In <u>second place</u>, to love God means to **keep His commandments.** If we say we love God, what should we do? (See **1 John 5:3**)

To Love God means to **keep His commandments**. We are not talking about sentimentalism, but about yielding ourselves to the will of God revealed in the Bible. If we love God by keeping His commandments, what additional benefits will we receive according to **John 14:21**?

Wonderful! We will be loved by the Father, and His Son Jesus Christ, will manifest himself to us in a special way. How exciting!

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We are always obeying someone's desires, whether it is ours or someone else's. In Romans 6:16, thus what are we called?

What opinions or choices do we have?

A person who always does the will of another is a *slave*. As believers, we can **choose our master**: sin (**disobedience**) which leads us to death and corruption; or **obedience** which leads us to justice and abundant life In **Romans 6:22** what are the benefits of being a slave to obedience?

In <u>third place</u>, we should be obedient for the reasons found in the following verses. What does our obedience show?

In each verse we have seen that He expects us to be obedient only because **He told us to obey.** According to**1 Timothy 6:14,** to what extent should we be obedient?

If we should obey Him "without spot or blame" then we should be obedient with a sincere heart simply because He **as asked it of us**, without trying to get something for doing it. He can not be manipulated by our obedience.

How do we become obedient?

In today's world it is not easy to be obedient because we must change or do things that cost us. There are **four steps necessary to achieve an obedient life**. In the following verses find the first step (or principle) to be obedient:

The first step is in each verse: the **need to know and understand the commands** before they can be obeyed. We must grow more in the knowledge of the Word in order to understand what He wants us to do. Do you even know the Ten Commandments? Did you know that there are 183 commands in the NT for us to obey? According to Philippians 1:9, what should continue growing in our lives?
